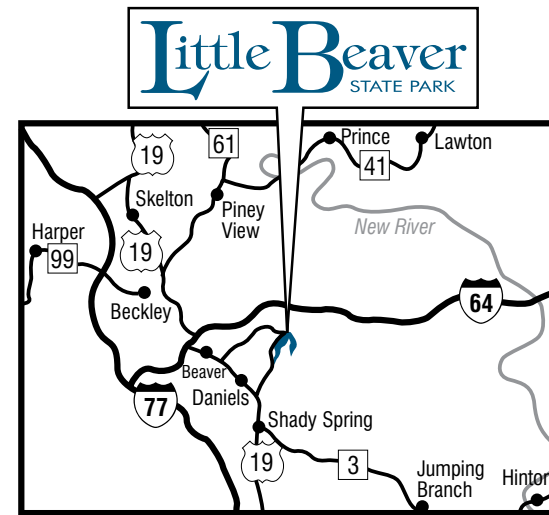

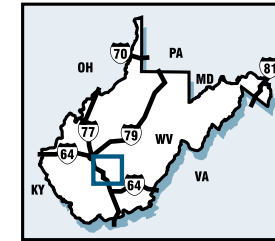

Trail Descriptions

Beaver Creek Trail—.5 mile

Many seasonal wildflowers and a stand of virgin pine and oak are features of this half-mile trail that encircles a portion of Beaver Creek. The trail runs above the lake.

Billy Goat's Gruff—.6 mile

This trail is a challenging bike trail full of rocks and steep inclines. It is an extreme challenge.

Creek Bed—.4 mile

A moderate wooded trail for bikers or hikers.

Deer Loop—.4 mile

This trail connects Deer Trail with Nature's Ridge. It is an easy-to-moderate wooded trek with a natural view.

Deer Trail—.8 mile

An open trail with changing terrain. The trail changes from an open field to a steep wooded incline.

Creek Bed—1.75 mile

This trail is the second-longest trail in the park. It follows the park boundary along Country Club Road and is an easy-to-moderate walk with changing scenery.

Nature Ridge—.8 mile

This trail has an incline, sometimes steep, that follows the ridge above the lake.

Railroad Grade—.9 mile

The scenery along this trail ranges from deep woods to open meadows.

Rhododendron Run—2.1 mile

This trail—the longest in the park—follows the park boundary with extreme terrain challenges to bikers or hikers.

Topper's Ridge—.6 mile

This rocky trail is considered a moderate-to-extreme trail for bikers.
